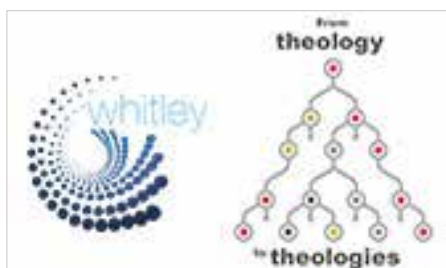
Crucible Course - 2 and 16 February 2019
